

# THE FUTURE OF VOTING

Starting 2018, all registered voters in particular counties will receive their ballot in the mail. You will no longer be assigned to a polling place. **You can vote in 1 of 3 ways:**



## VOTE CENTER

You can go to any Vote Center in the county to cast your ballot in-person. All Vote Centers will be open for 4 days, including the weekend. Some will be open 11 days in a row. (Check your ballot instruction for locations. Most prior polling places will not be in use.)

At a Vote Center, you can:

- Register to vote at some locations
- Update your voter registration (such as change your address)
- Receive a replacement ballot once the system verifies you have not voted in the same election
- Vote with an accessible voting equipment
- Receive language assistance and translated information
- Drop off your ballot



## DROP BOX

As soon as you receive your ballot in the mail, you can drop off the completed ballot at any secure and locked Drop Box located across the county.



## VOTE BY MAIL

You can mail back your completed ballot to the county election office in the envelope provided.

## WHY THE CHANGE?

More and more, voters are changing their voting behavior to vote by mail. The new system is to accommodate the lifestyle of the "modern voter":

- **11 days of in-person voting, including Election Day:** Instead of having to vote on one day, you can vote within an 11-day period - even over the weekend.
- **Any location in the county:** You can vote at any Vote Center in the county instead of at one assigned polling place.
- **Same day registration:** You can register to vote or update your registration and vote on the same day at some Vote Centers.
- **Customer service:** Vote Center poll worker staff will be thoroughly trained to focus on customer service for the 11 days of voting.
