The Voter's Choice Act

The California Voter's Choice Act (VCA) became law in 2016.

- Five counties are pioneering the change in 2018:
 - Madera
 - Napa
 - Nevada
 - Sacramento
 - San Mateo
- All California counties can choose to adopt in 2020.





Why are our elections changing?

The Voter's Choice Act is designed to make voting more convenient and accessible.

You choose **how** you vote You choose **when** you vote You choose **where** you vote You get the **support** you need








How to Return a Ballot

All registered voters will receive their ballot in the mail a few weeks before an election. You will have 3 ways to return your ballot:



By Mail



Ballot Dropbox



Vote Center





Vote-By-Mail



You can mail back your ballot.

Voters with disabilities may use their own accessible technology to mark their ballot at home.





Ballot Dropboxes





You can drop off your ballot at <u>any</u> Ballot Dropbox located throughout your county.

No postage is required at a Ballot Dropbox.





Vote Centers



You can drop off your ballot at any Vote Center in the county

You can vote in person at <u>any</u> Vote Center in the county for up to 11 days -- even on the weekends.

Vote Centers will replace traditional polling places.





What Else Can I Do at a Vote Center?



- Register to vote or update registration
- Vote in multiple languages
- Vote with an accessible voting machine





Missed the Voter Registration Deadline?



You can still register and vote on the same day all the way through Election Day.

- 1. Visit a Vote Center or the elections office
- 2. Register to vote
- 3. Vote
- 4. Seal your ballot in a special envelope and sign it
